

- ___ 4. In general uses “good English,” but with occasional grammatical or word-order errors which do not, however, obscure meaning, (e.g. “I am needing more English,” “He gave to me the letter”).
- ___ 3. Meaning occasionally obscured by grammatical and/or word-order errors.
- ___ 2. Grammatical usage and word-order definitely unsatisfactory; frequently needs to rephrase constructions and/or restricts himself/herself to basic structural patterns (e.g. uses the simple present tense where he/she should use past or future).
- ___ 1. Errors of grammar and word-order errors as to be virtually unintelligible to “the person in the street”.
- ___ 0. Speech so full of grammatical and word-order errors as to be virtually unintelligible to “the person in the street”.

IV. VOCABULARY

- ___ 5. Use of vocabulary and “idioms” is virtually that of a native speaker of English.
- ___ 4. Rarely has trouble expressing himself/herself with appropriate vocabulary and “idioms”.
- ___ 3. Sometimes uses inappropriate terms and/or round-about language because of inadequate vocabulary.
- ___ 2. Frequently uses the wrong words; speech limited to simple vocabulary.
- ___ 1. Misuse of words and very limited vocabulary make comprehension difficult.
- ___ 0. Vocabulary is inadequate for even the simplest conversation.

V. GENERAL SPEED OF SPEECH AND SENTENCE LENGTH

- ___ 5. Speech speed and sentence length are those of a native speaker.
- ___ 4. Speed of speech seems to be slightly affected by language problems.
- ___ 3. Both speed and speech and length of utterance are apparently affected by language difficulties and limitations or by native language habits.
- ___ 2. Speed of speech and length of utterance seem strongly affected by language difficulties and limitations or by native language habits.
- ___ 1. Speed of speech and length of utterance are so far from normal as to make conversation quite difficult.
- ___ 0. Speech so halting and fragmentary, or affected by native language habits as to make conversation with “the person in the street” almost impossible.
